Dimensions of Marble is a nonprofit organization whose mission is to define and honor the legacy of Vermont Marble. The program was conceived and founded in 2005 by a group of Vermont Citizens who believed the story of marble, its history, its artistry and the people who worked in the marble industry should be documented and shared with all Vermonters as well as national and international audiences.

Project: The Vermont Marble Trail – In 2008 the trail was launched. A beautiful four color brochure is available statewide highlighting notable Marble from Bennington to Isle la Motte. We will continue to enhance the trail as the years go on with plaques, sculptures and other forms of public art.

Project: The Marble Minutes – For over a year *The Rutland Herald* has printed our weekly column featuring Dr. Michael Austin's history of the marble industry.

Project: The Heritage Walls – Immigrants who came to this country to work in the marble industry will be honored on Walls throughout the state. The first was unveiled in Proctor in September. It is located in front of the Vermont Marble Exhibit. These walls are a fundraiser for Dimensions of Marble.

Project: Heritage Media – Emmy award-winning filmmaker Caro Thompson is recording and videotaping interviews with the people whose family members who immigrated from all over the world to work in Vermont's marble industry. These interviews will be edited and posted on a variety of websites as well as at all of the Vermont Welcome Centers as part of our trail displays. Eventually Caro will be doing a full length documentary.

Project : International Carving Symposium – We are currently gearing up our fundraising for this three week event in late 2011. We will host 10 sculptors from around the world who will carve 10-ton blocks of local marble donated by OMYA, Inc. The works created will become the focal point on key locations on the trail.

Project: Educational Kit – This resource will contain everything needed to teach a comprehensive unit on marble that meets the Vermont Framework of Standards and Grade Expectations. Topics will include science, history and art.
