**Dimensions of Marble** is a nonprofit organization whose mission is to define and honor the legacy of Vermont Marble. The program was conceived and founded in 2005 by a group of Vermont citizens who believed the story of marble, its history, its artistry, and the people who worked in the marble industry should be documented and shared with all Vermonters, as well as national and international audiences. Dimensions of Marble consists of six distinct projects planned for release at times from 2008 - 2011. This brochure documenting the Vermont Marble Trail is the first of several projects that are being produced by the organization.

### Dimensions of Marble projects in the works!

#### PROJECT: The Cultural Heritage Wall

Marble workers of the past and present will be honored on Heritage Walls, crafted from Vermont marble and installed in Proctor, West Rutland and other Vermont towns along the Marble Trail.

#### PROJECT: Cultural Heritage DVD

This project is a production of a short DVD designed to pique people's interest in the history and uses of marble, inspiring them to explore the Marble Trail tour.

#### PROJECT: Cultural Heritage Film

Emmy award winning film maker Caro Thompson is interviewing immigrants and their families to tell the story of what it was like to come to this state and work in all aspects of the marble industry. This film will be in the Welcome Centers as well as made into "pod casts" for websites throughout the state to share the wonderful stories.

#### PROJECT: The International Stone Symposium

The first two of our three-phase sculpture programs have been held in China and we hope to be able to complete our third phase at the Carving Studio in West Rutland in 2011. This is the main focus of our fundraising over the next eight months.

#### PROJECT: Educational Lending Kit

The kit is a set of grade-specific educational plans, hands-on learning materials, and background resource materials professionally packaged and shared among classrooms throughout Vermont.

#### PROJECT: The Marble Trail

This is a self guided driving tour that is placed throughout the State in welcome centers and business. We are raising money now to match a Federal Grant that we received for the second printing. The cover of the book features the bridge in Proctor.
